General Notes

When taking notes students can:

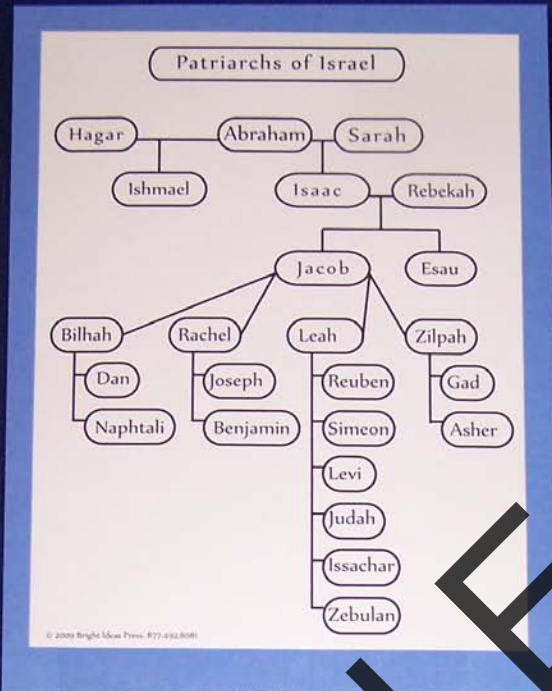
- Figure 13 directions: cut out figure 13 and fold on the dotted lines to bring the points to the center of the square to form a pyramid.

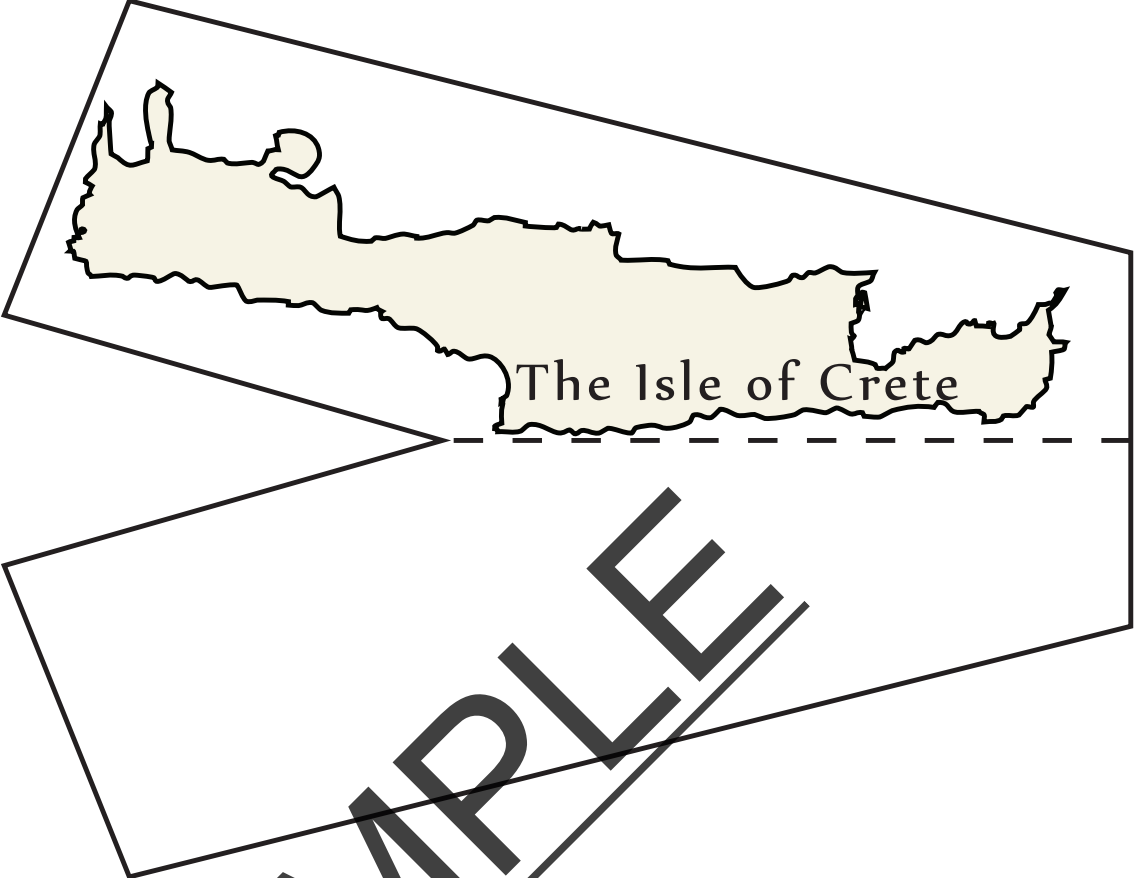
